Rules:

- 1. The speech must be original to the student and must be developed during the round. No pre-written or memorized speeches are allowed.
- 2. Once in the contest room, the student will be given a choice of three topics in the form of pictures designated for that section by the judge in that room. The student will then be

given a total of 5 minutes in which to prepare and speak. How the time is divided is totally up to the student but is subject to critique by the judge.

3. Maximum time limit: 6 minutes. There is no minimum time requirement. Unused

preparation time may not be added to the speaking time

4. No outside sources or material may be brought into the competition room other than blank paper. The speaker may write notes during prep time, but written notes cannot be used during the speech.

5. The speaker may approach the topic creatively, but the chosen topic must be the central theme of the speech and not peripheral to it. A one rank penalty is required for failure to

adhere to the chosen topic.

6. Content must be appropriate for all audiences.

7. Humor is permitted, but must be in good taste.

8. If there is any situation not contemplated in the rules, the organizer's decision on the same shall be final.
